**The complete application must include the following documents,
combined into a single PDF file:**

1. The application form presenting the thesis project.
2. A copy of the diploma certifying the required five years of higher education.
3. The candidate's CV, maximum five (5) pages, followed by any supporting documents.
4. A letter or email of commitment from the thesis supervisor and/or the head of the specialisation, or the director of the host laboratory; where applicable, the CV of the professional co-supervisor.
5. A portfolio (layout flexible), in PDF format, explaining the candidate's professional practice. It may contain photos, drawings, etc. For the *Practice and Theory of Literary Creation* specialisation, it may contain relevant extracts from the candidate's works. Websites are accepted, and the URLs must be provided in the portfolio. The portfolio is limited to five (5) pages, except for the *Arts* specialisation, where there is no page limit.

The application file must be named as follows: PSGS_HCH_AAC_2026_Candidate's name.

This summary may be used by EUR for communication purposes.

Objectives and description of the thesis topic (maximum 900 words):

In describing the project, candidates should focus on the issues to be addressed or questions likely to arise, the scientific objectives and the strategy for achieving them.

How the topic fits into the framework of a project-based PhD (maximum 150 words):

Candidates should emphasise the link between theory and practice in project-based research.

Importance of the project-based PhD in the candidate's career prospects (maximum 150 words):

Candidates should explain the expected impact of the project-based PhD on their career development.

Supervision

Only to be completed if the candidate has identified at least one supervisor.

Identifying supervisors at this stage of the application is not mandatory, but it is strongly encouraged.

The project-based PhD requires dual supervision: academic and professional (see Regulations, p. 5):

- *The thesis supervisor with HDR (= Habilitation à Diriger des Recherches, or accreditation to supervise research) must be affiliated with the CY Cergy Paris University Doctoral School No. 628 Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences (AHSS). His/her role is to guide you in research methodology, scientific analysis and thesis structure.*
- *The professional supervisor's role is to support you in the professional practice of the project.*

Portfolio

A portfolio of the candidate's work (layout flexible), in PDF format, explaining his/her professional practice. It may contain photos, drawings, etc. For the specialisation in Practice and Theory of Literary Creation, it may include relevant excerpts from the candidate's work. Websites are accepted; URLs must be provided in the portfolio.

The portfolio is limited to 5 (five) pages, except for the Arts specialisation, where there is no page limit.

Candidate's CV

The candidate's CV should be no more than 5 (five) pages long, followed by any supporting documents.
